This includes providing models of proficient problem solving, verbalization of thought processes, guided practice, corrective feedback, and frequent cumulative review.

Strategy 1:

Step Up strategies help students actively engage in reading materials for improved comprehension and demonstrate competent study and critical thinking skills.
